GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - World: Tree coverage expanded in 36 countries between 2000 and 2020. When it comes to forests, most of the news is discouraging, given a loss of over 247 million acres of trees since the turn of the century. The satellite and lidar technology used to detect tree coverage can only measure trees that are at least 16 feet tall. That means trees planted in recent years, including efforts to restore forests haven't yet been captured in the data. Researchers estimate that a little over one-third of the forest gain is thanks to intentional planting, with the rest attributed to natural generation.

Seniors interested in being considered for Broughton's nomination for the Morehead-Cain:

UNC-Chapel Hill's Morehead-Cain Scholars Program provides an annual stipend to cover college expenses, including tuition, room & board, books, student fees, and spending money; four distinct summers packed with transformational experiences around the world; Lovelace Fund for Discovery grants to support educational opportunities plus the ability to form close relationships with mentoring professors. The Morehead-Cain is based solely on merit; **financial need is not considered**. The selection criteria include leadership, scholarship, moral force of character, and physical vigor. **Broughton may nominate up to four students**. Completed forms must be returned to Mr. Rudder no later than Tuesday, September 6.

Seniors interested in being considered for Broughton's nomination for the Levine Scholars Program at UNC-Charlotte: Scholars will receive full tuition, room, board, books and mandatory fees for eight semesters of undergraduate study. Scholars will also have access to funding for four summer experiences, up to an \$8,000 service grant and a professional development fund. The combined value of the scholarship over four years is \$105,000 for North Carolina residents. Seniors interested in the Parks Scholarship Program at NCSU: North Carolina State University's Park Scholarship is a four-year award valued at \$109,500 including the full cost of education, and funding for a personal computer, educational trips, retreats, seminars, and grant opportunities. The Park Scholarship application is currently online at www.park.ncsu.edu and no longer requires an endorsement from Broughton.

To be eligible for the Park Scholarships program candidates must be a United States citizen applying for fall, first-year admission into a baccalaureate program at NC State. Deadline for applications is November 1, 2022.
