GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - South Africa: South Africa passed new legislation to better protect women from gender-based violence. A government study from 2020 found that 21% of women in South Africa have experienced physical violence by a partner, with higher rates among lower-income women. The legislation broadens access to protection orders, allows intermediaries to give evidence of abuse in court, recognizes "sexual intimidation" as a punishable offense, and obligates adults to report sexual offenses against vulnerable persons, among other changes.
