

GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - United States: The Navy welcomed its first Black female tactical jet pilot last month after Lt.j.g.Madeline Sweghle completed her final undergraduate flight. In the 1980s, Brenda Robinson became the first African American woman to serve as a Navy flight instructor and VIP transport pilot, but she did no fly fighter jets. In the years since, the Navy has often been criticized for its lack of diversity, especially among fighter units. A 2018 investigation found that of 1,404 Hornet pilots, only 26 were Black and 33 were female. The Navy's Tactical Air [Strike] aviator program prepared Lieutenant Swegle to fly several tactical jets, including the F/A-18E/F Super Hornet.
