**GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Scotland:** By using excess wind power to produce eco-friendly hydrogen fuel, the Orkney Islands in northern Scotland have become an unlikely leader in the renewable energy field. The islands have powered themselves with wind farms and tidal turbines for years. In fact, these methods were so successful that local electrical grids couldn't handle the amount of power being generated every day. To keep the turbines running, officials have started redirecting the surplus energy into various green energy projects, namely producing carbon-neutral hydrogen fuel.

The SAT will be administered at Broughton TOMORROW. Students registered to take the test should report by 7:45 am with an Admission Ticket, acceptable photo id, two No. 2 pencils and a soft eraser [No PENS or MECHANICAL PENCILS], acceptable calculator, and a snack. Your photo ID must be a physical valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission Ticket. Health screenings will be conducted outside prior to entry so plan for inclement weather if needed.
