GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - United States: Arizona's expanded Silver Alert system is helping recover persons with developmental disabilities. Originally designed for missing older adults diagnosed with dementia, Silver Alerts function similarly to Amber Alerts, with public notices issued through highway signs, news broadcasts, phone messages, and social media. The overall number of individuals safely recovered following a Silver Alert grew from 60 in 2015 to 131 last year, according to state figures.
