GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Bougainville: A record number of women are throwing their hat into the first general election since Bougainville voted to seek full independence from Papua New Guinea in a nonbinding referendum held in December last year, Representatives from the autonomous region of Bougainville must work with the PNG government to negotiate the terms of the separation. PNG is one of only three countries with no women in parliament, but Bougainville has made steady gains in women's political participation since its decadeslong civil war ended in 1998.
