GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - United States: A Texas university offers a model of affordability that is boosting economic mobility. The University of Texas Rio GRande Valley serves a student body that is 90% Hispanic and made up primarily of first-generation college students. Over 60% of students qualify for federal Pell Grants, awarded to those with high financial need. Additional funding is provided by the state, and UT Rio Grande Valley has its own program that helps cover cost gaps. The majority of students pay no tuition or fees; the average cost to attend was \$917 in 2019-20, compared with \$7,907 for UT Austin.


