GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Colombia: Conservationists are training ex-combatants to help preserve Colombia's biodiversity. Researching the country's wildlife was a challenge during the decadeslong civil war, but since the 2016 peace agreement, expeditions in former conflict zones have discovered more than 150 new animal and plant species. Wildlife geneticist, Jaime Gongora, visits Colombia several times a year to conduct workshops training former members of the Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia [FARC] in various conservation skills, including taking biodiversity inventories.
