GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Australia: Australia will phase out gill net fishing in the Great Barrier Reef by 2027. Often measuring more than a kilometer in length, gill nets hang vertically in the water to trap target fish, but they also capture bycatch that will be discarded. Other animals - particularly turtles, dugongs, and dolphins, - can become entangled in the nets and drown.

Seniors: Scholarship Bulletin #1 was put in Senior English/CAPS Class Teachers' boxes last Friday. It has also been posted on the Student Services Webpage and in the display case outside the Guidance Resource Center.

Seniors interested in being considered for Broughton's nomination for the Levine Scholars Program at UNC-Charlotte: Scholars will receive full tuition, room, board, books and mandatory fees for eight semesters of undergraduate study. Scholars will also have access to funding for four summer experiences, up to an \$8,000 service grant and a professional development fund. The combined value of the scholarship over four years is \$105,000 for North Carolina residents. Completed forms must be returned to Mr. Rudder no later than Friday, September 15.

Seniors interested in the Parks Scholarship Program at NCSU: North Carolina State University's Park Scholarship is a four-year award valued at \$120,000 including the full cost of education, and funding for a personal computer, educational trips, retreats, seminars, and grant opportunities. The Park Scholarship application is currently online at www.park.ncsu.edu and no longer requires an endorsement from Broughton. To be eligible for the Park Scholarship Program, candidates must be a United States citizen applying for fall, first-year admission into a baccalaureate program at NC State. Deadline for applications is November 1, 2023.
