GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - France: The world's largest urban rooftop farm, called Nature Urbaine, has started bearing fruit. On one day recently, young farmers atop Paris Expo's Pavillion 6 picked 3,000 lettuces and 150 pints of strawberries from aeroponic growing towers - plastic columns that are soil-free, use little water, and take up less space than traditional garden beds. The roof is the size of two soccer fields, but only a third has been planted. When it's all in use, staff could harvest more than a ton of fruits and vegetables every day.
