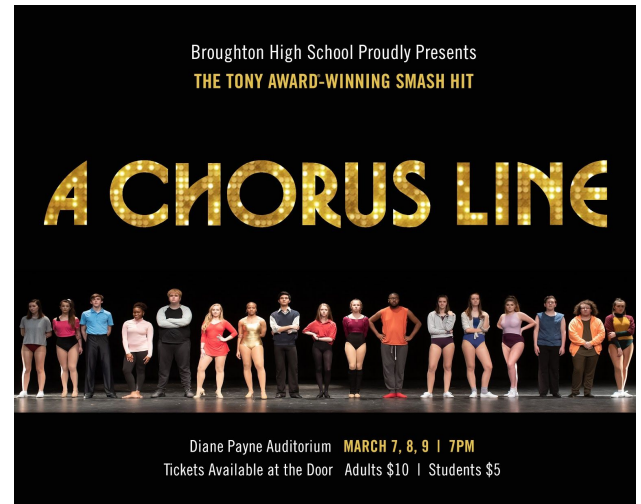

Students registered to take the test should report by 7:45 am with an Admission Ticket, acceptable photo id, two No. 2 pencils and a soft eraser [No PENS or MECHANICAL PENCILS], acceptable calculator, and a snack. Your photo ID must be valid [unexpired], original, government- or school- issued, and bear your full legal name. The name on your ID must exactly match the name on your Admission or Waitlist Ticket.
