Resume Writing Workshop: March 15



Swarthmore College has asked Broughton to nominate students for their <u>Discover Swarthmore (DS) fly-in program.</u> Discover Swarthmore is an all-expenses-paid visit to one of the best <u>liberal arts</u> and engineering colleges in the country. Prospective students get a taste of the college experience, including the opportunity to meet current students, learn from faculty members, eat in our dining hall, and spend a few nights in our residence halls with student hosts. While the fall 2019 program dates have not yet been finalized, we plan to offer two DS programs to give students maximum flexibility. Last year, we hosted programs in mid-September and early November. Discover Swarthmore is open to all rising high school seniors. The selection committee prioritizes applications from students with the following characteristics:

- Underrepresented students (African-American, Asian-American, Hispanic/Latino/a, Middle Eastern and North African, and Native and Indigenous American)
- First generation in their family to attend college
- Low-income students (Pell-eligible, free/reduced lunch, etc.), and students who might not otherwise be able to afford a trip to campus
- Rural and small town students
- Undocumented and DACA-eligible students

Additionally, we invite applications from any rising senior (U.S. citizens, Permanent Residents, and undocumented/DACA students attending school in the United States) who is interested in attending, regardless of demographic or economic background. Swarthmore supports all forms of diversity, including—but not limited to—racial, ethnic, ideological, sexual/gender identity, geographic, and religious diversity.
