Washington & Lee has invited Broughton to nominate some of our high-achieving students for their fall fly-in program called the Diversity and Inclusion Visit Experience (DIVE).

Prospective rising seniors (Class of 2020) approved for the DIVE program are invited to a two-day, all-expense paid program for rising high school seniors with a focus on personal engagement with faculty members and current students, attending classes, life in a residential campus community (including staying in residence halls), and a primer on W&L's admission and financial aid process.

Students who we think would benefit from participating in the DIVE program include: First-generation college students, low-income students (Pell-eligible, free or reduced lunch, and students who would qualify for The W&L Promise which guarantees the minimum of tuition to any undergraduate student admitted to Washington and Lee with a total family income* below \$100,000 and assets typical for their income), and students historically underrepresented in higher education (African-American, Hispanic/Latino, Native American). Consider a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to start your college career with a hands-on adventure like you've never experienced before. Apply for the 2019 Colorado GeoJourney - NC State's only immersive geosciences field course for incoming first-year students. Each year the Department of Marine, Earth, and Atmospheric Sciences partners with the University Scholars Program to facilitate this two-week experience that builds an immediate community with a group of peers, brings the geosciences to life through a two-week field course, and starts students' college career with 3 credit-hours of coursework that may count toward their GEP required coursework. If you crave education in action, the great outdoors, and building community then you should consider this opportunity to learn how the geosciences are utilized in multiple facets of daily life. GeoJourney explores the relationships between the geosciences and society along one of North America's greatest waterways - the Colorado River. Participants will:

- Spend 2 weeks learning & exploring along the iconic Colorado River.
- Learn how geoscience knowledge will be essential in shaping our future world.
