Broughton has been asked to nominate up to *five* current juniors for the Junior Scholars Program at High Point University. To qualify for membership into the Junior Scholars Program, students must meet the following requirements:

- If submitting test scores: 3.45-4.0 GPA (unweighted on a 4.0 scale)
  - Evidence Based Reading & Math SAT Score between 1220-1600 or ACT Score between 25-36
  - If not submitting test scores: A high school GPA 3.6-4.0 (unweighted on a 4.0 scale)
  - Leadership and achievement in one or more of the following activities: an area of academic interest, community service, the arts, athletics, entrepreneurial endeavors or international adventures.

Juniors: Dartmouth has asked Broughton to identify some of our stand-out rising minority juniors as candidates for their three-day residential college-access program scheduled this July 15-17. Participating students will receive an in-depth introduction to the enduring value of a liberal arts education through Dartmouth's curriculum and faculty, experience the state-of-the-art facilities available to them, and make meaningful connections with their peers.
