GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - GERMANY: The country is shutting down all 84 of its coal fired power plants. Germany is one of the world's biggest coal consumers, and it has been missing its emissions reduction targets in recent years. The new plan, which aims to shut down all plants over the next 19 years, will enable it to meet its international commitments for emissions reduction. Currently, 40% of Germany's electricity comes from coal-fired plants.
