GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS - Egypt: Robots are taking the place of child jockeys in a major traditional Egyptian camel racing festival. The Bedouin sport has long used children for their small size and lightweight, but the practice has come under criticism by human rights organizations that say some child jockeys are abused and malnourished. This year, 20 of about 150 camels were controlled

by robots instead of children as bans in neighboring countries and local campaigns add pressure to camel owners to change.
