The country is also vulnerable to tsunamis and experienced a major one in 2004. The microcars can drive 100 miles between charges, and while they aren't intended to be true amphibious vehicles, they are equipped with waterproof batteries and are buoyant enough to float in an emergency. A Japanese automotive designer worked with a Thai investor to bring the vehicles to production.
