GLOBAL POINTS OF PROGRESS -SOUTH AFRICA: Anti-poaching efforts are seeing results for rhinos in South Africa. The country's environmental affairs office reported a significant decline in the number of rhinoceros poaching incidents in 2018. And it's the third year that those numbers have fallen. Officials say the drop is due to better security measures for the animals among other policies aimed at saving them.

The North Carolina Department of Information Technology, along with Governor Cooper, is participating in [Girls Go CyberStart](#), a free, online, cybersecurity competition for girls in high school grades 9-12. Through this

program, students will be able to compete against students from 25 other states in a series of puzzle-solving and information technology challenges to earn scholarship money, prizes, and money for their schools. At least 10 students from our state will get \$500 scholarships. Students and teachers do not have to have previous experience in coding, cybersecurity, or information technology in order to participate. This is the second year our state has participated in the program, which was very successful in its inaugural year. Many students loved participating and having the opportunity to be introduced to cybersecurity as a career option. Currently, there are 22,000 unfilled information technology jobs in North Carolina. Registration is now open and closes March 25, 2019. Students can begin playing on March 20. We would love to have a big group representing North Carolina this year!

The Raleigh-Wake Alumni Chapter of **Winston-Salem State University** is sponsoring a college visitation day **Saturday, April 6, 2019**. This college visitation is open to all high school sophomores, juniors and seniors with at least a 2.0 GPA. **The cost of the trip is \$20.00 per person.** The deadline to submit the registration form and check/money order is 5:00 pm. Junior Scholars have the unique opportunity for non-binding early acceptance to High Point University and will receive an initial \$2,500 scholarship per year to HPU, totaling \$10,000 over four years. If an admitted applicant is eligible for any HPU merit-based scholarships in excess of \$2,500 per year, the higher scholarship will be awarded in its place. The Junior Scholars Scholarship is contingent on the student enrolling at [High Point University](#). Students accepted into the Junior Scholars program will be honored at a Junior Scholars Luncheon during the October 7, 2019 Open House on HPU's extraordinary campus. Junior Scholars with completed applications by Friday, September 14th who also attend the October Open House will be notified of their acceptance at the Luncheon. Additionally, Junior Scholars who apply to any of the Fellows Programs will receive priority review of this additional application.
