**JUNIORS:** Twenty-four rising seniors will be selected for the NC Community Development Initiative’s YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM. Participants will receive a \$750 stipend for the three-week program that includes two overnight stays in the RTP area, all expenses paid. **JUNIORS:** TAR HEEL BOYS’ STATE. Boys’ State is an intense workshop concentrating on North Carolina state government and politics. Only males who have successfully completed their junior year of high school are considered eligible to participate. The program is held June 16-22 on the campus of Catawba College, Salisbury, NC. Boys’ State citizens organize a state government by nominating and electing candidates for offices in city, county and state governments. **JUNIORS/SENIORS:** AMERICAN LEGION STUDENT TROOPER PROGRAM. The Student Trooper Program will be conducted at the North Carolina Highway Patrol Training Center June 16-21.
