### EXPECT SOME CHANGES

We know the last few months have been challenging for our families. We have made a few adjustments to maintain a safe environment during this pandemic. The following adjustments that have been made to ensure your child's safety:

- Students lockers will not be assigned until social distancing guidelines have been lifted. All students need to plan accordingly.
- Assemblies, field trips, school dances, and club activities have been temporarily suspended until social distancing guidelines have been lifted. We will explore virtual options for clubs at a later date.
- Student agendas will not be issued this year. All handbooks can be viewed online. We will encourage students to utilize electronic planners to record homework and upcoming due dates.
- The regular bell schedule has been adjusted to accommodate the time needed to clean and sanitize desks between classes.
- New dismissal procedures will be implemented to maintain social distancing at the end of the school day. All students (in-person and online) will attend classes at the designated class time for the block.
- Students will report directly to first period classes upon arrival each morning. The auditorium and media center will not be open for students each morning. Students who eat breakfast will report to the dining hall upon arrival. Safety procedures will be in place.

## ATTENTION JUNIORS & SENIORS

### SAU UPDATE

SAU will open its campus in August to all students and will end the semester in November. All college courses will be on Blackboard, which will allow early college students to access courses from home if they are not comfortable attending in person.

SAU classes will begin in-person on Wednesday, August 12. Reading Day will be Friday, November 20. On-campus instruction will conclude on Wednesday, November 25. First semester final exams are November 23—25.

Fall classes will begin August 12, 2020, as previously scheduled, but fall break will be eliminated. The semester will end on November 25, 2020. Spring 2020 Classes will begin on January 6, 2021 and the academic calendar will continue as published, unless changes are warranted.

### UNIFORM DRESS CODE

Students in grades 6 –10 are required to wear school uniforms to school each day. Please visit our website to review the complete uniform policy which contains guidelines for each uniform item and vendor information.

## SCHEDULE CHANGES

Extensive time was spent developing a master schedule that provides the best educational opportunities for our students. Schedule changes have serious effects on staffing, class sizes, and academic programs and will only be made under certain conditions. The following is a list of these conditions:

- Incomplete schedules (missing a class)
- Failure of a prerequisite course or incorrect course (English II instead of English I)
- Completion of course during summer school
- Master schedule conflict (two courses in the same period in the same semester)

The following reasons are NOT considered appropriate reasons for schedule changes and will not be honored:

- Dropping or adding a course because you changed your mind
- Block (class period) preference
- Teacher preference

*Scheduling conflicts often result in incomplete schedules. We do our best to give every student a complete schedule. Please note that you may not get your ideal schedule, but you will have what you need to be eligible for graduation when the time comes. If you see a course in your schedule that you did not request, you probably had a conflict which resulted in an incomplete schedule. Please do not request a change unless it meets the conditions above.*

## TRANSPORTATION

The Wake County Public School System provides bus transportation to all eligible students based on their school assignment. The system's transportation department is committed to providing students with safe, efficient, and reliable transportation service that contributes to their overall academic success.

WYWLA students will use the Southeast Raleigh High School Express Bus transportation system. Each student will be assigned a bus and route number. **Students will only be allowed to ride the assigned bus.**

## CARPOOL PROCEDURES

WYWLA families must follow the designated carpool route from Western Boulevard onto the campus. Carpool riders will be released in front of Lineberry Hall during morning arrival and afternoon dismissal. Campus Security and WYWLA staff will direct traffic during drop-off and pick-up. Please follow their directions to insure the safety of all GMS community members. Families who do not comply will be addressed by WCPSS and GMS security officials.

To ensure the safety of WYWLA and GMS students, carpool drivers should follow the guidelines below:

- Drive slowly on campus and follow the directions of staff members who are assisting with carpool.
- Yield right-of-way to school buses and pedestrians moving about the campus.
- Follow the designated carpool routes; do not create different transportation routes to expedite your drop-off/pick-up. This is extremely important for the visually impaired GMS students who must adjust to our traffic routes as they are moving about campus.
- Pull around the entire circle as far as possible to allow as many cars to load/unload.

Carpool families should enter from the back of the GMS campus through the Western Boulevard entrance and exit through the same entrance. **Families should not park near the dining hall, gym, Currin, or the parking lot next to the Lineberry to pick up students.** It is important to follow these procedures in the morning during drop-off and in the afternoon for pick-up. These procedures should be followed even if staff members are not present to direct traffic. We will have special procedures for dismissal to allow for social distancing. Procedures will be shared before August 3rd.

Early college carpool students may arrive no earlier than 7:05am. Parents should enter through the main entrance and drop off in front of Robinson Library. SAU security officers will be on site to provide directions.
