## Report Cards Distributed Friday, April 12:

- Per Wake County policy, this is the final weighted cumulative average for determining Latin honors:
  Summa cum laude: 4.25 and above
  Magna cum laude: 4.0-4.249
  cum laude 3.75 3.99

### Tuesday, June 11: Graduation Reception at LRHS from 7-9 PM (RSVP was due May 22)

- 9 Graduation tickets will be given to each senior at this event. \*\*Please note this has been updated since the printing of the Senior Bulletin. THIS NUMBER OF 9 IS CORRECT.\*\*
- Seniors must meet not only all academic requirements, but must take care of all costs for damaged/lost school items as well as obligations to teachers, club advisors, and coaches, including uniforms, library books, parking tickets, etc. Until paid in full, seniors will not receive graduation tickets, nor his/her diploma.
- Seniors do NOT need a ticket. All other people, regardless of age, need a ticket for entrance.
- If you cannot come June 11, come to the school's main office from 8-9 AM on Wednesday, June 12 to receive your tickets.

Thursday, June 13: Commencement at the Convention Center at 4 PM.

- Graduates must arrive by 3 PM.
- Doors open to guests with tickets at 3:15 PM.
- Drop off area for graduates: McDowell Street side of Convention Center Drop off area for guests: Cabarrus Street. Avoid the Salisbury Street side of the Convention Center.
- When you enter, Entrances A and B (NOT Entrance C) are open to guests and closer to the seats.
- No seat saving is allowed. Please do not attempt to save seats and put faculty members in a position where they must tell you that is not permitted.
- People in need of a wheelchair will have an area to sit with space provided for that person's family.
- Appropriate behavior at this formal ceremony celebrating your child does not include yelling, screaming, or screeching. Please do not do so, and please request that your guests refrain from doing so. It is not fair to other families nor the senior who is announced immediately after your child. Most importantly, it is not fair to your own child. This person in the audience steals that moment that should be about your child's academic accomplishment.
