IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENT

North Carolina law now requires all rising 12th graders to receive a meningococcal vaccine booster before starting 12th grade. The vaccination must be done before the 25–26 school year begins. Parents will need to provide a copy of their child's immunization record showing proof that the meningococcal vaccine has been completed prior to the first day of school. This is a 2–dose immunization; the 1st dose was required in the 7th grade in Wake County schools. 

CERTIFICATION



- Prepares graduates for a specific professional career path
- Programs take between 6 week to 2 years to complete
 - Emphasizes practical skills and fieldwork
 - Types of certifications: Dental Assistant, Information Technology, Pharmacy Technician, Veterinary Assistant, and so much more!
- You can earn credentials at all of our North Carolina Community Colleges (ex: Wake Tech, Durham Technical, and Johnston County Community College)
 - Private trade Schools: Miller Motte, Paul Mitchell School of Raleigh

TWO YEAR DEGREE

- Community Colleges award certificates and associate's degrees
- Complete in 2 years or less
- Average annual cost of tuition & fees is \$3,440; No residential dorms
- Less strict admissions requirements. Specific program may have additional requirements.
- Average class size is 25-35 students

Wake Tech Community College has <u>University Partnerships</u> with all UNC System Schools to allow students to transfer to a 4-year university as a junior after completing their associate's degree at Wake Tech.






FOUR YEAR DEGREE

- Typically complete in 4 years
- Average annual cost of attendance is ~ \$20,000 (for NC public universities)
- Look at grades, test scores, essays, extracurricular activities, & more
- Typically offer on-campus housing
- Class sizes may vary from 20-300 depending on the school

Tuition is the same regardless of residency


UNC SYSTEM & TEST SCORES


For students entering in the Fall 2026 and beyond - **based on a** weighted GPA:

- GPA above 2.8 Test scores are optional
- GPA below 2.8: Students must submit either an ACT score of 17 or higher or an SAT score of 930 or higher.

Please note that, while these are the minimum requirements for consideration, *they do not guarantee acceptance*.

Components of Testing

SAT

Digital Reading, Math , Writing



ACT

Paper (can be Digital) Reading, Math, English, Science



BREAKDOWN OF CONTENT





5 reading passages

Calculator active and inactive

More time per question

Analyzing - tricky!

4 reading passages

Science - Assessing Critical thinking

Math - Calc active only

Less time per question (faster pace)

SAT vs ACT Scoring Information

SAT

- 400-1600 Scale
- Math is 200–800 Scale
- Reading/Writing
 (Evidence based
 reading and
 writing) 200-800
 scale

Both

- Both tests award +1 for correct answers and no points (+/-0) for incorrect answers
- Offer SuperScoring (the best subscore of each test will be added together to create your best highest score

ACT

- 1-36 Scale
- Scores from the 4
 sections are
 averaged together
 for overall score
- Each section is given a subscore

WHICH ONE?

SAT



Studies show an average of a 15 point increase on a 2nd test attempt.

ACT



50% of students show a score increase on a 2nd test attempt.



SHOULD I SEND MY SCORES?

TEST OPTIONAL

A wide variety of schools have indicated they will remain test optional through this application cycle (including the UNC System).

This means test scores are not required for a complete application.

Use previous years averages to determine if you should send your score-if your score is above their average standards it is a good indicator to include your scores

TEST BLIND

Test scores are NOT REQUIRED nor INCLUDED as part of the application.

SENDING TEST SCORES



Send Scores to up to 4 colleges for FREE when you register for SAT and up to 9 days after the test

Send via website later for \$14

Each score report contains all SAT scores for superscoring





Using space wisely

- "Attend practice and workouts 4x/week.

 communicated game plays, and assisted with tryouts"
- "Completed 15 hours of community serviced at local animal shelter assisting with pet adoptions and veterinary care during COVID-19"
- "Greeted customers, organized seating chart to maximize use of servers, responded to incoming phone calls, and assisted with take out orders"

RECOMMENDATION TYPES

COUNSELOR

- Completed by your academic counselor
- Overview of who you are as a student
- Overview of school
- Guided form
- Often required for college applications and scholarships
- Includes a School Profile and upload of Transcript



TEACHER

- Completed by teacher who can best speak to your abilities
- Not necessarily the teacher who you earned an "A" with but the teacher who can best speak to your abilities
 - maybe you contributed to class discussions, lead activities, participated in extracurriculars, or worked hard to master the subject area
- Often required for college applications and scholarships
