Autumn

Language Arts

Students will continue to work on their hero narratives. Following their writing organizers, students will begin to draft their stories. Using their first drafts, students will hone their writing skills by practicing with adjectives, adverbs and dialogue to add more details and depth to their stories. By the end of the week, students will be working on completing final drafts.

Math

Students will continue solving problems involving ratios. They will represent ratios as expressions, and represent equivalent ratios with double number line diagrams, tape diagrams and tables.

Science

Wednesday students will have the Unit Test for "Land Beneath Our Feet". Students will begin working on the study guide in class on Monday.

Social Studies

Students began their study of early humans by learning about the characteristics of hominids overtime, early human migration, and climate change. Next week, we'll continue with comparing the early stone age (Paleolithic era) with the new stone age (Neolithic era). Highlighting the Neolithic Revolution (Agricultural Revolution) and its impact on igniting the flame for organized civilization.
