## **Promotion**

## 9th to 10th grade » Must pass 6 courses:

- English I
- 2 of the 3 other core classes Math, Science, Social Studies
- 3 additional courses = 6 credits

## **Honors Level Courses- What Does It Take?**

**Independent learning** 

Discussions where you are prepared and participate

**Summer reading assignments** 

**Vocabulary is geared toward SAT prep** 

**Emphasis on critical thinking** 

**Emphasis on college level reading and writing** 

More mature student Current grades should be A's or B's on tests, 4s or 5s on EOGs

\*Significantly more work

## **AP Level Courses- What Does It take?**

**MORE rigorous than honors** 

Students take an AP exam and potentially receive college credit for that course

Shows colleges that students can handle college level work

\*Don't take honors or AP because someone you know did it....know YOUR strengths!

## **GPA calculations....**

**Example: 11th grader Joe** 

GPA= 31 QP / 8 courses = **3.875**




