Guidelines for Course Registration

Math Guidelines:

- Fundamentals of Math /Intro. to Math: Middle school teachers will recommend students register for Fund./Intro. based on their math grades, test scores, and other school data. Fundamentals is taken in the Fall. Introduction to Math is taken in the Spring.
- Foundations of Math 1/Math 1: Recommended for students who earned a C/D/F in 8th grade Math. This course is geared towards students who have some mastery of 8th grade Math but may need extra scaffolding and assistance. This course teaches the Math 1 curriculum over the entire school year to allow students more time to go in-depth to master the math skills taught.
 - NC Math 1: Recommended for students who earned an A/B in 8th grade Math. This course teaches Math 1 in a single semester and is geared toward students who are not in need of significant remediation or assistance.
- Math Plus/Honors Math 2: Recommended for students who earned a C/D in Math 1 in middle school. This is a yearlong course for students who need extra scaffolding and assistance in math.
- Honors NC Math 2: Recommended for students who earned an A/B in Math 1. This is a one semester course for students who are capable of keeping up with a faster pace of math delivery and earning a passing grade at the honors level.
 - Honors Math 3: Students must have passed Math 2 in 8th grade.
 - Honors Precalculus: Students must have passed Math 3 or higher in 8th grade

Science Guidelines:

- Honors Earth Science: Recommended for students who earned a B or above in 8th grade Science.
- Honors Biology: Recommended for students who earned a B or higher in both 8th grade English and Math 1.

Physical Education Guidelines:

- All students are required to earn 1 credit of Physical Education/Healthful Living in high school.
- Honors Healthful Living: Recommended for students who earned an A in 8th grade PE and who will be enrolled in Honors Math 2 or higher in 9th Grade.

World Languages Guidelines:

- Please register for only 1 language. Students are encouraged to take Level 1 and Level 2 in the same year.

CTE/Electives Guidelines:

- CTE/Electives courses are subject to change based on student demand and enrollment. Students select alternative elective courses in case the primary choice is full or ends up not having enough student demand to offer. Student needs and interests drive the master scheduling
