about it. Children are often too ashamed to let anyone know. Sometimes they feel that no one can help, not even their parents. The parents will learn to recognize different types of bullying and what the signs of bullying are so that they can better help prevent it.

14. Learn How to Motivate Your Child to Thrive in School

Why is it so hard to motivate kids? As parents, you can't force your child to be selfmotivated just because you want to. In fact, you might actually get in the way of their motivation. The parents will learn strategies to inspire and motivate their child.

15. Parent Advocacy and Engagement in Your Child's Education

Parents are often the best educational advocates for their child. Research indicates that being involved in your child's education has a positive correlation with being successful in school. The parents will learn key components about being engaged in their child's education.

16. Preparing Your Child for the End of Grade (EOG) Tests (3 -8th)

The EOG tests measure a student's abilities in various subjects, including reading and mathematics, through a series of exams implemented during the last three weeks of the school year. The parents will be provided with strategies to help their child feel at ease when taking the EOGs.

17. Reading is Fundamental! (K- 5th)

Reading is fundamental to function in today's society and in developing a good selfimage. One of the most effective approaches to help their child develop literacy skills is having a home environment that encourages reading in daily life. The parents will learn how to support the development of their child's literacy at home.

18. Resilience Documentary (for Middle and High School parents)

Resilience is a 60-minute documentary that delves into the science of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and a new movement to treat and prevent toxic stress.

19. Starfall! Teaching K-2nd Children to Read and Inspiring a Love of Learning

Starfall is a children's website designed for children from preschool to second grade that teaches basic English reading and writing skills by using games and phonics. The parents will be introduced to how to use the program to help their child.

20. Teaching Your Child How to Deal with Peer Pressure

Every day your child makes decisions based on what his peers say and do. The family will learn how to help their child make good decisions, to say "yes" to positive peer pressures, which help them become better individuals, and "no" to negative peer pressure.

21. Tips for Successful Parent-Teacher Conferences

Parent-teacher conferences are an important component of ongoing home-school communication and family involvement in the child's school. Years of research demonstrate that family engagement in education can lead to positive benefits for children and youth. The parents will learn how to have a successful parent-teacher conference.

22. Today's Math: "I didn't learn math like that!" (K-5th)

Are you struggling to help your child with his/her math homework? Are you confused by this new math? Well, come learn more! The parents will have an opportunity to learn about the K-5th math standards and how this builds to later success in math. Resources and strategies for providing help at home will be shared.

23. Transitioning to High School

Transitioning into high school can be a challenge for students and parents. The parents will learn about graduation requirements, honor courses, advanced placement, how to calculate the GPA, extracurricular activities, and the Home Base Parent Portal, which gives real time information including attendance, arades, and assignments.

If your child is headed to middle school, don't panic! The parents will learn what to expect and what steps to take to ensure their child is ready for a smooth transition. They will also learn about the day-to-day school routine, extracurricular activities options, and how to access the Home Base Parent Portal.

The parents can help their child develop writing skills and equally important, a love for words and writing. The parents will learn ways to encourage writing at home.
