## French or Spanish - 2 high school credits

In North Carolina, the University of North Carolina schools require two years of a foreign language during high school for admission. Who should consider earning TWO high school credits in middle school?

- Students that wish to pursue Honors level world languages and Advanced Placement credits once in high school
- Students that participate in IB or another type of global studies program in High School
- Students that are college bound and plan on taking additional language credits while in high school
- Students that are looking into applying to a highly competitive college/university
- Students that can commit to the rigor and study habits and time required in taking high school level courses as a middle schooler
- Students planning on working in high school in a job that would benefit from being bi-lingual

## French or Spanish - 1 high school credit

- Students that wish to pursue Honors level world languages and Advanced Placement credits once in high school
- Students that are college bound and plan on taking additional language credits while in high school
- Students that need to free up elective space options in high school to pursue skill-specific studies
- Students that can commit to the rigor and study habits and time required in taking high school level courses as a middle schooler
