Planning for College

- UNC system **minimum** admissions requirements:
 - 2.5 weighted GPA,
 - 880 minimum SAT (Reading and Math),
 - 17 minimum ACT composite,
 - Two successive levels of foreign language,
 - Math beyond Math III



Understanding ACT Score Reports

<u>Reminders:</u>

- When taking a standardized test, you must use your full legal name. Nicknames and/or misspellings may mark your test results invalid.
 It should match your name on PowerSchool
- The PreACT showed you a predicted ACT range, and provided information about your strengths and areas for improvement

• When you register for an ACT test date, you can select up to four institutions to which the ACT will send your scores. You must pay for additional score reports after the test date.


• You receive a copy of your scores to the address listed on your registration.


Composite Score - the average of all subject areas (Math, Science, English, Reading)





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If you took the writing test, your essay was scored on a scale of 1 to 6 by two raters in each of the four writing domains. These domains represent essential skills and abilities that are necessary to meet the writing demands of college and career. Your domain scores, ranging from 2 to 12, are a sum of the two raters' scores. Your

Sending Your Scores

A score report (including your photo) was automatically sent to the high school you reported when registration was completed for the test. Your school will use this information for counseling, evaluating the effectiveness of instruction, and planning changes and improvements in the curriculum.

At your direction, your scores from this test date are also being reported to the colleges shown. (Be aware that when you send a report to a college that is part of a school system, the college may share your score with other colleges in that system.) Institutions use your test scores along with high school grades, academic preparation, out-of-class accomplishments, future plans, and other factors to help identify applicants who can benefit most from their programs. In addition, colleges can use results on the ACT to assist scholarship/loan agencies in identifying qualified candidates, place students in first-year courses, and help students develop an appropriate program of study.



Typical Composite Score on a Retest





43% of ACT test takers chose to take the test more than once last year, and more than half of them improved their scores.
