#### STUDENT TECHNOLOGY

- All students will be assigned a student Chromebook at the beginning of the 2021-22 school year
  - If your student does not have a Chromebook checked out, they will receive one

### WHY IS ORGANIZATION IMPORTANT?

Improves grades	<ul> <li>Student may use a planner (online or paper), color-coded notebooks/folders</li> <li>Student sets a homework schedule, sets up a study area, and takes breaks</li> </ul>
Reduces stress	<ul> <li>Student feels empowered</li> <li>Harder for the student to catch up than to stay on time</li> </ul>
Builds self-confidence	<ul> <li>Student decides what is important</li> <li>Student makes the plan</li> <li>Student rewarded for a job well done</li> </ul>

#### STUDENT SERVICES
