Here is an interview with 5th grader Calliope Mandel, who celebrates Hanukkah.

What activities do you do when you celebrate Hanukkah?

"We always light the candle at sundown and we get gifts each night of hanukkah. And Dreidel is where we can win gelts (chocolate coins)"

Are there any special meals during Hanukkah?

"Yes we eat latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot which is (jelly donuts)."

Why do Jewish people celebrate Hanukkah?

"A few Jewish people were forced to live in a cave. They needed a light for eight days but they only had one jug of oil and one candle. They lit it and it miraculously stayed lit for eight days."

Are there any special facts you would like to share?

"There are many ways to spell it but the way I spell it Chanukkiah (pronounced Hanukkah). It is also celebrated on a different day every year."

Are there any representatives of another meaning of Hanukkah?

"Yes the festival of lights"

Is there any special way to light the menorah?

"First you light the chumash then use its flame to light the other candles, depending on which night it is. For example, on night one we light the first one on the left. Left to right each night "

Is there something you do for dreidel?

"Yes we sing a song and it goes like this:

'Dreidel dreidel I made you out of clay and

When it's dry and ready, oh dreidel, I should play.'

There are also different symbols on the Dreidel starting with nungimnel, hay, shin."
