Academic Updates

Spotlight on our Third Grade Team

<u>Literacy</u>- In the month of February Third grade students started working on EL Education's module 3, which is a case study of the literary classic "Peter Pan" by J.M. Barrie. They learned its historical context and about the author. They have also been reading chapters of Peter Pan, analyzing character traits and actions, and also comparing their point of view to the point of view of the characters. In March, students will move to comparing Peter Pan to another one of JM Barrie's classics, Peter Pan in Kensington Gardens. They will analyze how the stories are alike and different and what the author wants the readers to learn from these stories. Third Graders will celebrate their Peter Pan learning with their annual Peter Pan Play on April 2nd with two performances during the school day.

<u>Math</u>-Third graders have started their journey to understanding fractions. They started out by working to understand partitioned shapes in halves, thirds, fourths, sixths, and eighths. In March they will be moving into recognizing fractions on number-lines. With this knowledge base, they will begin drawing and analyzing equivalent fractions, which will lead them into comparing fractions.

<u>Social Studies-</u> Students are wrapping up their NC history unit. They discovered how our capital city got started, and who was involved in that process. They looked at how our city and state have changed over time including important people who took a stand to make important changes.

<u>Science</u>- They will be working on understanding the relationship between the Sun, Moon, and Earth, as moving parts that work together to provide structure and life for us living on Earth. They will also be **celebrating their learning with the Mobile Planetarium**, which will be visiting our school on March 12.
