Academic Updates Spotlight on our Specialists Team

Media Center – The Media Center will kick off the New Year in K-2 with research that includes learning how to ask questions and find sources. Grades 3-5 will visit the media for library lessons that will help them find sources independently and launch their research units.

Spanish (grades 3-5)- In January, students will use the language to present information to an audience and work to complete a short skit inspired by The Legend of the China Poblana (Mexico) and present it to their peers. The second standard students will learn involves comparing cultures. Students will learn about the Hispanic holiday Dia De Los Reyes and compare it to other holidays. Lastly, students will understand words and concepts in the target language by learning and reviewing vocabulary with a focus on the family and the house.

Music - Students will be learning how to interpret rhythm patterns for quarter notes, quarter rests and eighth notes and will understand the relationships between music and concepts from other subject areas. They will also work to apply changes in dynamics and tempo when singing and playing music and ask and answer such questions as who, what, where, why, and how to demonstrate understanding of key details in a text. Students in upper grades will interpret simple pitch notation in the treble clef in major keys and use standard symbols to notate rhythm and meter in simple patterns.

Physical Education - The first of the year will be busy! Students will finish jump rope skills (a favorite every year), locomotor, and fitness. Quiz your child on the five components of fitness: flexibility, muscular endurance, muscular strength, cardiovascular endurance, and body composition. Team sports is up next: basketball, hockey, and soccer. All three have similar skills. Coach Smith will assess students dribbling, passing, and shooting skills and how they work cooperatively during game play. Early congratulations to those First in Fitness students! FIF is only for 5th through 2nd grade and selection is based on fitness scores. All students will use the data collected to set individual attainable fitness goals. Our posttest will include push-ups, pull ups, and pacer. See you in 2020!

Art - 5th grade will be creating rain-sticks as a team (in collaboration with classroom teachers and music with a focus on the Rainforest). 4th grade students will be creating a tinfoil relief, and 3rd graders will focus on the art from the Art Museum, specifically ancient Egypt (Field trip on Feb 7th). 2nd grade will work to create the dinosaur that generated the fossils they have been studying (collaboration with classroom teachers-learning about fossils in classroom). 1st grade will be creating bird drawings (collaboration with general education curriculum) and kindergarten will focus on fine motor skills through projects, such as cutting, and practicing drawing skills.
