ACT-SO (Afro-Academic, Cultural, Technological, and Scientific Olympics)** is a prestigious NAACP program that inspires, supports, and recognizes high academic and cultural achievements among African American students. The 2025 local ACT-SO Competition will take place in April in Raleigh, and gold medalists will advance to the National ACT-SO Competition in July, hosted in Charlotte, NC. National medalists have historically earned scholarships, iPads, AirPods, and more! ACT-SO features 31 categories spanning STEM, humanities, business, performing arts, and visual arts. Since its inception, nearly 300,000 students have participated nationwide. For over three decades, ACT-SO has been dedicated to preparing, recognizing, and rewarding youth of African descent who demonstrate exceptional scholastic and artistic talent.

Swarthmore College, one of the nation's top liberal arts and engineering colleges, **has asked Broughton to nominate interested rising seniors for their all-expenses-paid fly-in program Discover Swarthmore. Nominations are due Sunday, June 15, 2025.** Nominees stay on a college campus for a few days and get a taste of the college experience — meeting current students and professors, eating in the dining hall, and spending a few nights in college dorms with student hosts — with all expenses paid by Swarthmore. Not only do students get a glimpse of college life, but they also gain valuable information about college admissions and financial aid from experts. Fly-in programs are also a helpful way to see if a specific college is the right fit for them. While the Fall 2025 program dates have not yet been finalized, we typically offer two Discover Swarthmore programs, in mid-September and late October, to give students maximum flexibility. All interested rising high school seniors (U.S. citizens, permanent residents, and undocumented/DACA students attending school in the United States) are welcome to apply to Discover Swarthmore, though preference will be given to students who are the first in their families to attend college, students from low-income backgrounds, and students who might not otherwise be able to afford a trip to campus. **If interested, see Mr. Rudder in Student Services, Room 1202.**

Junior interested in Wofford College:

Wofford College [Spartanburg, SC] has invited Broughton to nominate **current juniors** for their annual Wofford Scholars Program. Qualified candidates are eligible to compete for scholarships ranging from \$15,000 per year up to a full scholarship. The deadline for nominations is October 19, 2025. Any nominations submitted after October 19th will be considered on a case-by-case basis. The criteria for nomination are as follows:

- Students should rank in the top 10% of the class.
- Students must have achieved a minimum score of 1300 (critical reading and math combined) on the PSAT/SAT or 28 composite on the PLAN/ACT.
- Students should demonstrate qualities of scholarship, leadership, and potential for success. Students should also have an interest in attending Wofford College.

All students who are nominated for this program must apply by either our Early Decision or Early Action deadline. Nominees are screened by the Wofford Scholars Selection Committee. If your students meet the criteria, they will be invited to participate in Wofford Scholars Day in November. If interested in being nominated, see your counselor.

STEP is a chance for **rising high school seniors [Current Juniors]** to experience the best of what the Wilson College of Textiles and NC State have to offer. During one of five weeks in the summer of 2025, students will have the opportunity to meet faculty, staff, current students and alumni while exploring textiles through projects, workshops and other activities. Students will live in our residence halls, eat in our dining halls and see what it's like to be a college student. STEP will take place during the following weeks:

- Week 1: June 8 – 13
- Week 2: June 15 – 20
- Week 3: June 22 – 27
- Week 4: July 6 – 11

- Textile Pioneer Week: July 13 – 18 (Students from Tier 1 and 2 counties only)

Each student has the opportunity to rank their level of interest in one of the subject areas below and will complete a project pertaining to that subject.

- Fashion Design
- Textile Engineering and Technology
- Business Management
- Textile Design
- Polymer Chemistry

The STEP application opened on January 1 and will close on April 15. If you have any students interested, please invite them to apply here. Summer Leadership Camps for High School Students:

Spend this summer giving back to your community and growing as a leader. Earn 35 hours of community service per week. **2025 Impact Camp.** IMPACT Camp provides Triangle high school students with a local week-long summer service experience. Together, a diverse cohort of participants learn about the issues facing their community by visiting different community organizations, working on a variety of service projects, hearing from community leaders, and engaging in reflection activities. Age: Rising 9th thru 12 grade students. There are four weeks of IMPACT Camp.

- Week 1: June 16-20
- Week 2: June 23-27
- Week 3: July 7-11
- Week 4: JULY 14-18
