# Our Typical Day... ... when we are back in the school building:

- Students arrive starting at 8:45 am
- Instruction begins at 9:15 am
- Morning Meeting, Readers and Writers Workshop, Math, Social Studies, Science
- Lunch and Recess

- Specials (Art, Music, Physical Education, LOGIC, Library, Health and Fitness
- Dismissal begins at 3:45 pm (Carpool, Bus, Walkers, After School Care)



# Our Typical Day... ... if we are still in a remote learning platform:

- Each day begins with Morning Meeting which is currently at 9:00 am.
- Students are given access to pre-recorded lessons on new content instruction
- Each teacher holds office hours on specific days to further assist student learning
- Lunch and Recess
- Specials (Art, Music, Physical Education, LOGIC, Library, Health and Fitness



### Staggered Entry... if we are back in school at the start of the 20-21 school year:

•Staggered entry is a transition activity aimed at helping to ease your family's transition into Kindergarten.



•Each Kindergarten child will come for one full day during the first week of school (during the week of August 17).

•Smaller group sizes allow the staff to offer individual attention and support as children try new things.

•An informal assessment is integrated into the day through play activities. This assessment, along with observations over the first few weeks of school, will allow the staff to plan for the smoothest transition into "Big School" for your child.

### <u>Staggered Entry... if we are back in school at</u> <u>the start of the 20-21 school year:</u>

- The dates for staggered entry will be communicated in a welcome letter sent during the summer. We ask for all of our families to reserve the week of August 17 for your assigned staggered entry day.
- Meet the Teacher Thursday, August 20 from 4:30 to 5:30 pm
- First full day of school Friday, August 21... YIKES!

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 Specific information regarding transportation and student lunch numbers will be sent home at the end of your child's staggered entry day.



# Student Engagement... if we are still using a remote learning platform at the start of the 20-21 school year:

- Prior to the start of the school year, your assigned teacher will be in touch with your family to set Google Meet with you and your child.
- At the Google Meet, your teacher will explain the processes and programs used for the remote learning platform.
- Parents will spend time accessing and exploring the shared learning programs.
- \* ??? A Meet session will be held between the teacher and the class to practice the meeting protocols ???
- First day of Remote Learning: Monday, August 17



### Preparing Your Kindergartener

• Focus on the positive - Your attitude determines your child's attitude!

•<u>Communicate</u>: Submit important papers, pin notes for the teacher on the outside of your child's book bag (lunch, transportation information)

•Ease your child into the school schedule and routines early. Waiting until the day before or the 1<sup>st</sup> day of school will set your child up for a difficult start.

•Get plenty of rest, and expect tired children for the first few weeks

•Let your child guide the after school conversation (they will be processing a lot from the first days and may not be able to sort through everything at first).

# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Health Assessments</u>

• Health Assessment (with up to date immunizations... the parent, guardian has 30 calendar days from the first day of attendance to present the required written proof of immunizations... students may be excluded from school until proof is provided). If you have any questions about your child's immunizations please contact the school prior to the start date.



# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Medication</u>

- Medications will be administered at school ONLY if a Physician Order for Medication, form 1702, is completed, signed by physician and parent, and is in the possession of school officials.
- These forms are available at the front office.
- The Medication form and the pharmacy label information must match.
- ALL medications must be in the original pharmacy container with original label on it.



# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Keeping your child healthy</u>

- Children learn best when they eat a healthy breakfast and receive adequate sleep. Five year olds require 10-11 hours of sleep every night.
- It is important for your child to attend school daily and to be on time.
- Studies show that frequent hand washing prevents colds and flu... Instruct your children in good hand washing techniques.



# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Chronic Illness</u>

- If your child has a chronic illness such as diabetes, severe asthma, severe allergies or seizures, please contact your school nurse.
- A health care plan can be developed indicating steps to be taken if your child requires medical care at school.



# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Keeping your child home from school</u>

- Fever of 100 or higher (should be fever free for 24 hours before returning to school).
- Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea
- Severe headache

- Red, watery eyes with yellow drainage
- Undiagnosed rash



# <u>Health Concerns and Kindergarten</u> <u>Nurse Support</u>

- School Nurses in Wake County are employed by Wake County Human Services, Wake County Public Schools and serve 2-3 schools each.
- Nurses provide services 1 to 2 days per week in each school.

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 One goal of School Health Services is to keep all students healthy and safe in order to improve attendance and educational outcomes.
