The paper will simply be your personal reaction to the book. **There will be no summary in your paper.** Adding the class late will not excuse you from this assignment. Thinking you were getting AP Psychology during the spring semester and not the fall will not excuse you from this assignment. If you are prepared to take an AP class, you should be ready for the class when you take it.
