An Important Reminder

As we return from the Winter Vacation and begin 2016, we want everyone to look at this time as a fresh opportunity to start anew. Here are a few reminders about how you may support your child through the rest of the school year (and really beyond as well).

The first, and I would say the easiest practice, is to make sure that your child is at school on time everyday. When students are late to school, it starts their day off in a stressed fashion, as they will struggle to catch up to the rest of the class for the day. It also creates an unfair situation for the other students in the class, who managed to arrive to school on time, and now have to have their day and learning interrupted as the tardy student is caught up. Likewise, please remember that the students' day ends at 3:45 pm. When students are picked up prior to the end of the day, they miss valuable class time and instruction and cause an unfair interruption to the rest of the class' learning. <u>For this reason, without prior notice, we will</u> no longer call students from their class after 2:45 pm. Finally, please make sure that you are speaking with your child about their day and checking their homework thoroughly. Very little shows that you care about their learning and education more than demonstrating an active interest in their day and what they are being taught.
