This year, with two members of our faculty currently serving in the US Armed Forces, 1LT Mary-Lynn Kebker, North Carolina Army National Guard, and Staff Sergeant Jaclyn Perricone, United States Army Reserves (better known as 4th Grade Teacher, Ms. Kebker and Health and Fitness Teacher, Ms. Perricone), it just seemed appropriate to have this program facilitated by the experts.

Since the first day of this opportunity, our 4^{th} grade Flag Patrol has embraced this important role and demonstrated total regard for many considerations when putting up and taking down the flag each day. We further look forward to the opportunity for this program to be extended to more of our oldest Cubs, and to become a rite of passage tradition here at Leesville Elementary School.
