2021 Governor's School

June 20-July 28, 2021

What is Governor's School?

It's an exciting educational experience for academically, intellectually and artistically gifted high school students which lasts for five weeks in the summer. There is a fee to attend and that fee will be determined by mid Spring 2021. Areas of study include English, mathematics, natural science, social science, French, Spanish, dance, choral music, instrumental music, visual art and drama. The academic programs are limited to current juniors (11th grade), however 10th and 11th graders will be considered for the performing arts programs.

To Be Considered

Students who are nominated or who ask to be considered are evaluated based on GPA, Rank, and the student's application. To be considered for a nomination for Governor's School, Academic Nominees (current 11th graders) must have a 3.75 unweighted GPA and Arts Nominee (current 10th or 11th graders) must have a 3.50 unweighted GPA. Wake County Public Schools reads all student applications and essays and chooses its nominees who will be sent to the state selection committee. There are strict guidelines to follow and the process is very competitive.
