1. Promotion Requirements

All 9th graders should be making sure they are accumulating the credits they need in order to be promoted at the end of the school year. Unlike middle school, promotion is not a "decision" but simply a reflection of credits you have earned. In order to be promoted to 10th grade, you must have:
6 total credits; 1 of those credits must be English I; and you must have credits in 2 of the other 3 core areas of Science, Math, and Social Studies. If you have questions about this, please see your counselor (Ms. St. Aubin) or Mr. Poppe.

On Thursday, April 26 at 7pm we will meet with parents and students who signed up for Advanced Placement (AP) courses for the 2018-19 school year.  university you are interested in attending (or not attending). These are always excused
 absences when you submit the <u>Request for Educational Absence Form</u>.
