1. Early Release / Late Arrival and Midyear Graduation for 2018-19

While we will accept requests for this over the summer and up to the first five days of the semester, we will not guarantee that we can make your request happen at that point. 4. College & Career Readiness

As your senior year comes closer, we encourage juniors to begin planning for your senior year including:

- Have you considered taking college courses now for FREE? The State of North Carolina allows currently enrolled high school students who qualify to take courses at their local community college (for us, Wake Tech) for free while enrolled in high school. The program is called Career Promise. The first step of accessing this resource is attending a required orientation. We have an orientation session at HSHS on Wednesday, March 28 at 6:30pm.
- Have you taken the ACT or SAT yet? If not, you should sign up soon. More information on ACT Testing can be found at this link. More information on SAT Testing can be found at this link.
- Have you started your Brag Sheet? Your Brag Sheet is a great resource to help you when applying for colleges and will be essential when you start talking with individuals to write recommendations for you. If you have not started this yet, now is a good time!
- Have you created your CFNC Account yet? If you have not set up an account on <u>CFNC.org</u> (College Foundation of North Carolina), you are encouraged to do this. It will be an important site throughout your senior year.
- Have you considered an internship? Our school helps to organize a number of internships for students who want to have an experience in a desired career field. If you are interested, please see Mr. Herrick (sherrick@wcpss.net) or visit this site.
- **Have you started college visits?** College visits are a great way to help determine what kind of university you are interested in attending (or not attending). These are always excused absences when you submit the <u>Request for Educational Absence Form</u>.
