1. Advanced Placement (AP) Night - Thursday, April 26

On Thursday, April 26 at 7pm we will meet with parents and students who signed up for Advanced Placement (AP) courses for the 2018-19 school year. 2. College & Career Readiness

As your high school career comes closer, we encourage sophomores to be planning for the options they want after graduation.

Have you considered taking college courses now for FREE? The State of North Carolina allows currently enrolled high school students who qualify to take courses at their local community college (for us, Wake Tech) for free while enrolled in high school. The program is called <u>College & Career Promise</u>. The first step of accessing this resource is attending a required orientation. We have an orientation session at HSHS on Wednesday, March 28 at 6:30pm.

- Have you taken the ACT or SAT yet? You should definitely start thinking about taking the SAT and/or ACT in your junior year. You will take the ACT once in the spring semester of your junior year for free at school. HSHS is not a test site for the SAT. More information on ACT Testing can be found at this link. - Have you started your Brag Sheet? Your <u>Brag Sheet</u> is a great resource to help you when applying for colleges and will be essential when you start talking with individuals to write recommendations for you. If you have not started this yet, now is a good time! It often takes some pressure off in the senior year if you start recording your achievements along the way.
- Have you started college visits? College visits are a great way to help determine what kind of
 university you are interested in attending (or not attending). These are always excused
 absences when you submit the <u>Request for Educational Absence Form</u>.

3. School Safety Updates

We appreciate the work that all students are doing to support school safety. The school has been wired for a buzzer system at external doors that will allow us to have all doors locked throughout the school day. We will keep you posted on this.
