Acceptable Use Policy 2019-20

Why Bring Your Own Device?

Holly Springs High School is dedicated to providing 21st Century instruction to all its students. Allowing students to use their own electronic device will promote continued integration of technology within daily instruction.

What is a Personal Electronic Device?

A personal electronic device is considered to be any of the following devices: iPad, Tablet, Laptop, or Smartphone.

Is BYOD required?

No, bringing and/or using a personal electronic device is voluntary and will never be required by a teacher.

Students participating in the BYOD program at HSHS will be expected to abide by the following:

1. Students will follow red, yellow, and green “zone” guidelines when using personal electronic devices around the school campus as communicated by teachers and classroom signage. Students should assume that classrooms are red zones unless otherwise instructed by their teacher.
2. Students should access the internet via the WAKE-BYOD Wi-Fi network while on campus.
3. When permitted during teacher monitored activities, students will use headphones while listening to audio files on their device. The volume should be kept at a level that allows the student to hear directions from adults.
4. Unless otherwise permitted during a teacher monitored class activity, students may not use a device to record, transmit, or post photos/video of a person(s) on campus. This provision applies to all students and school personnel at any time and location.
5. Participating students will accept full responsibility of their device and keep it with them at all times. Holly Springs High School is not responsible for the loss, damage, or theft of personally owned devices.
6. Students will never be required to allow another student to use or handle their device.
7. Students should not rely on access to outlets within the building to charge their devices.
8. Electronic Devices are considered personal belongings and may be subject to search in accordance with the WCPSS Code of Student Conduct.
9. Violations of any WCPSS Board policies involving a student’s personal electronic device may result in the loss of BYOD privileges and/or disciplinary consequences.

Student BYOD Responsibilities

Any zone violation will result in normal enforcement of the Electronic Device policy. Students will be asked by school personnel to hand over the electronic device. The device will be locked in the main office until a parent/guardian can pick up the item. Students who fail to hand over an electronic device will receive consequences for non-compliance under the HSHS Code of Student Conduct.
