All senior students planning to attend college and meet the criteria requirements should consider applying for the Emma L. Cunningham Memorial Scholarship. The scholarship must be utilized for tuition only and will be paid directly to the recipient's college of choice.

## **Criteria for candidates:**

- Graduating senior student from GMHS
- Acceptance to higher learning institution or vocational school
- Extracurricular achievements & participates in community service
- Student willing to provide updates on progress throughout school career

## How to apply:

- Write an essay on **both** of the following:
  - Think of a significant experience or achievement in your life that helped influence your decision to pursue higher education.
  - Discuss what makes you a great candidate for this scholarship and how you see yourself positively contributing to our society.
- Copy of your college acceptance letter & high school transcript.
- Attach a cover letter stating your full name, date, class ranking and all extracurricular activities.
- Attach head shot photo (senior photo requested if possible) of yourself.
- Submit to the Academic Counselor, Stacy Davidson by March 2nd, 2018.
