
What is Student Services?

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Promotion Requirements

- Promotion to Grade 10:
- Minimum of six credits-
- One credit must be <u>English I</u>, <u>two</u> must be in the areas of <u>math</u>ematics, <u>social studies</u>, or <u>science</u> and three additional credits to total six.
- Promotion to Grade 11:
- Minimum of twelve credits-
- Two credits must be <u>English I</u> and <u>English II</u>, one must be <u>math</u>ematics, one <u>social studies</u> and one <u>science</u>, plus seven additional credits to total twelve.
- Promotion to Grade 12:
- Minimum of eighteen credits-
- Three credits must be English I, English II and English III, and enrollment in remaining courses required to graduate.

English	4	English I, II, III, and IV
Math	4	Math I, Math III, 4 th math
Science	3	Earth/Environmental Science, Biology, Physical Science/Physics/Chemistry
Social Studies	4	World History, Civics and Economics, American History I and II
Health & PE	1	Healthful Living
Required Electives	6	2 electives of any combination from either CTE, Arts Education or Second Language 4 electives <i>strongly recommended</i> to concentrate in one area (CTE, Arts, or any other subject area)
Additional Electives	4	Courses from any area
TOTAL	26	MINIMUM required to graduate


