Wake Tech



- The only requirements for entrance to Wake Tech are a high school diploma and ACCUPLACER test scores and/or SAT/ACT scores (see WTCC website for additional information).
- Options:
 - 2-year Associates Degree
 - College Transfer Program
 (transfer to a 4-year university after two years)
- A great option for students who would like to "start over" academically.
- Affordable \$76 per credit hour (about \$1068 total cost for a full 12 credit semester).

UNC System Admissions Requirements


- 4 units of English
- 4 units of Math, 1 unit for which Algebra II is a prerequisite (it is recommended that students take a math during their senior year).
- 4 units of History
- Earth Science, Biology, and a Physical Science
- 2 levels of the same foreign language
- SAT and/or ACT
- Minimum Requirements:
 - O GPA: **2.5**
 - O New SAT: **880**
 - O ACT: **17**

Independent Colleges and Universities

Private and independent colleges sometimes have more flexible entrance requirements.
Check with individual schools for specifics.



Pon't let sticker price deter you from considering a private or independent college. They usually give great financial aid packages!!!!

Senior Planning Checklist

Seniors

- Start Planning NOW!
- Discuss expectations and financial aid with your parents.
- MEET DEADLINES!!!!
- Make sure applications are sent in at least a week before the deadline to ensure prompt arrival and make copies of all applications.
- Teacher/counselor should get at least two weeks to complete any recommendations.
- Keep a folder for each college & a calendar with deadlines & documentation of any contact with admissions officers, etc.

Parents

- Help your child clarify realistic goals.
- Discuss your expectations and/or financial limitations with your child.
- Allow student to complete his/her applications. Personal responsibility is a part of becoming an adult!
- Visit colleges with your child if possible or at least take a virtual tour @ www.cfnc.org
- Consider travel accommodations

CFNC Checklist

12th Grade Fall Don't Let Up

- Review courses, graduation requirements, and scholarship opportunities with your counselor.
- Update your CFNC planner.
- Select three to five colleges—a dream school, a safety school, and others in between.
- Track application and financial aid deadlines for colleges.
- Take the first SAT or ACT offered this fall.
- Write, edit, proofread, and rewrite your admissions essays early.
- Ask teachers, counselors, or references to write letters of recommendation.
- Attend college day and participate in College Application Week, if available.
- Complete online college applications at CFNC.org before the deadlines.
- If your high school participates, use CFNC.org to send your official high school transcript to colleges.
- Send in any other college applications.
- Check with college financial aid offices for school-specific scholarship information and forms.
- Student athletes send transcripts to NCAA Clearinghouse for eligibility certification.
- Remind parents to plan to prepare tax information soon after January 1 for your financial aid applications.

12th Grade Spring Finish Strong

- Go to www.pin.ed.gov to get an ID number to e-sign your FAFSA.
- Complete and submit FAFSA at www.fafsa.gov as soon as possible after January 1.
- For help with your FAFSA, sign up at CFNC.org for a February FAFSA Day near you.
- If not accepted by your college of choice, use the College Redirection Module at CFNC.org to find new options.
- Compare admission acceptance letters and financial aid packages.
- Send in your enrollment deposit to hold your spot at the college you choose.
- Apply for education loans, if needed.
- Make sure your final high school transcript is sent to your college (goes automatically if CFNC.org sent earlier).
- Send in any early college credit course transcripts (community college, middle college).
- Take exams for any AP or college-level courses completed.
- For community college admission, check with your local campus about placement testing requirements.

Applying to College

Admissions look at:

- Course work
- GPA
- Class rank
- SAT and/or ACT scores
- Extracurricular activities/Jobs
- Essays, Recommendations, and interviews (if required)



Application Tips

- Read all instructions before beginning
- Know **DEADLINES!!**
- Students should fill out applications
- Complete applications online or fill them out in black/blue ink-Make them NEAT!
- Fill out transcript request a week prior to the date you need the transcript to arrive.

- Use CFNC to send your transcript to any NC college or university.
- The request policy is in your folder and on the GMHS website

Counselor Statements and Teacher Recommendations

Counselor Statements

•Some colleges or universities will want a counselor statement along with your transcript. This form is provided in the application — bring it to your counselor at least 2 weeks in advance.

Recommendations

- In general, teachers are the best source since they see you everyday in the classroom setting.
- •Pick your teacher recommenders wisely. It's important that your teacher knows you personally, not just that you did well in that class.
- •When requesting a recommendation, you should provide a resume* listing all activities you participated in while in high school.
- Don't take it personally if a teacher is unable to write you a recommendation
- •Promptly send a thank-you note to each person who gives you a recommendation.


