Is A Four-Year NC Public University in Your Future? Minimum Admission Requirements: 2.5 weighted GPA

880 on Math and Critical Reading combined of the new SAT or 17 Composite ACT

Two of your ten elective credits must be Level I and II of the same World Language

You must complete NC Math I, NC Math II, NC Math III and a higher level math beyond NC Math III

<u>Private</u> Four-Year Colleges can have different minimum admission requirements.

Know and meet college/university application deadlines.

Four Year College Admission is **COMPETITIVE** and admission offices evaluate applicants in regard to the rigor of their curriculum, GPA, class rank, SAT or ACT scores, extra-curricular activities in school and volunteer work in the community. Senior year courses and grades are very important! Seniors should not change their schedules as College Admission Offices expect seniors to successfully complete all courses listed on the transcript submitted with their college application. Continue to challenge yourself academically to get admitted to college and to better prepare for college work!
