Charm School I and II

Charm School I: June 12-23, 2017 or Charm School II: July 10-21, 2017

The program is focused on developing self-worth, poise, proper communication skills, anger management, forgiveness, etiquette and hygiene. The graduates of Charm School will be mentored on a continual basis to reinforce their skill development. Students will also participate in a community service project.
