



- KNOW graduation and promotion requirements
- ATTEND parent nights, advisory committees, athletic/arts events
- JOIN a club/organization/sport
- ATTEND tutoring and ask for help/ADVOCATE for yourself
- TALK to your teachers, parents, administrators, school counselor, Link Crew advisers AND SEEK help if you are dealing with academic, career, or social emotional issues
- SET a goal to pass all 8 of your classes with a 70 or higher
- ATTEND class every day and BE on time
- ESTABLISH/MAINTAIN healthy relationships with friends/peers
- IMPORTANT SKILLS TO MASTER: study skills, time management, reading, writing, organizational skills, research, stress management, conflict-resolution and decision-making
