Project Pipeline is an architectural summer camp that was created by The National Organization of Minority Architects (NOMA) in 2005. This is the 14th year of nationwide summer camps for middle school and high school students who are interested in the profession of architecture!

Volunteers shall present students with a project site and design prompt. Our volunteers primarily consist of licensed architects, emerging design professionals and architecture students. Students will learn site analysis skills, basic programming, and thoughtful design processes. The weeklong project and activities provide students with physical drawings and models that emphasize community design. Students shall leave this camp more confident in their design abilities and the belief that what they have learned is applicable to various realms within the built environment. The project prompt will ask students to imagine a safe and empowering place for protestors, and then design a Center for Social Justice!
