<p>I-Pre-1820: Slaves worked in the South picking cotton, a crop made tremendously profitable by the invention of the cotton 'gin. Slaves were owned by their masters and their master's property rights were protected by the 5th Amendment in the Bill of Rights and several places in the Constitution.
